PRACTICE TEXT / CONTEXT

Some city libraries lend more than books. A growing number lend tools, sewing machines, board games, and other useful objects. These collections can reduce the cost of trying a new hobby or completing a small repair. Libraries choose items based on local needs, storage space, and safety rules, so the exact collection differs from one branch to another.

CENTRAL IDEA

Some libraries now lend useful objects in addition to books.

ESSENTIAL DETAIL 1

Tool and object lending can help people try activities or complete small tasks without buying everything themselves.

ESSENTIAL DETAIL 2

Each library selects items according to local needs and practical limits such as space and safety.

LEAVE OUT

The individual examples—sewing machines, board games, and tools—illustrate the idea but are not all necessary in a concise summary.

DRAFT SUMMARY

Some libraries lend practical objects as well as books, helping patrons access items without purchasing them. The available collection varies because libraries choose objects based on community needs, space, and safety requirements.
